The Illustrators of George MacDonald's children's stories.

The children's books of Huntly-born writer George MacDonald have been published many times since they were written in the late 19th century and generations of wonderful illustrators have brought these magical stories to life.

For the first time ever, you can see the work of 48 of these illustrators brought together in a stunning new exhibition.

Find out about George MacDonald, his life and family, his imaginative and enduring children's books, and the illustrators who have depicted the fantasy worlds he created - princesses cursed to defy gravity or never see daylight; evil goblins living below ground; a poor shepherd boy who diverts a stream through his father's cottage and discovers a band of inebriated river fairies; a child taken away by the wind to the North Pole.

This exhibition brings these stories to life and shows why MacDonald is today renowned as 'the father of fantasy fiction.'

Story-telling with pictures

This exhibition brings together stories told in illustration by Scottish artists from the Victorian era to the present day. It includes children's picture book illustration, comic books, animation, graphic novels and the work of current children's illustrators such as Ross Collins, Meg McLaren, Tom Morgan-Jones, Natala Ilincic and Kate Leiper.

See the work of the artists who originally created the Beano, Dandy and Oor Wullie. Find out more about Judge Dredd artist Tom Foster, graphic novelist Tom Humberstone and Guardian newspaper cartoonist and children's writer Tom Gauld. See working sketches from award winning animator Simon P Biggs and take part in making a community animation in the gallery.

As well as a story corner, art station, and toy theatre to keep the young ones entertained, there will be screenings of the best international children's animations from the Dundee Film Festival.









There are no school events planned on the morning of Thursday 29th August and the morning of Monday 9th Sept.



Illustration Exhibition at Leith Hall

Henrietta Leith-Hay (born Louisa Henrietta Valdivia O'Neill in 1879), came to Leith Hall in 1907. She was a talented watercolour artist and as part of the Huntly Illustration Festival, Leith Hall will be showing a small selection of prints featuring her children's illustrations. These delightful illustrations are brimming with Victorian humour and characters. Entry to the exhibition is included in your ticket to Leith Hall and is free for members of the NTS.

From 29th of August - 9th of September there will be a special discounted rate of £4 for exhibition visitors only, including entry to the Military Museum. (This does not include entry to the rest of the hall).

Leith Hall is open Thursday – Monday, 10:30 – 4pm (Last entry 3:30pm). Entry to the hall is by guided tour only. Tearoom open 10:30 – 3:30pm for home-made soups & scones, cakes & hot drinks.



Caw Caw illustrated by Scottish illustrator Jemima Blackburn (1823–1909)

A new Doric translation of a story about a family of rooks living on Scotland's west coast, with original illustrations by influential Scottish illustrator, Jemima Blackburn.

Jemima Blackburn's illustrations combine with this new Doric translation to introduce new generations to the tale of an epic feud between rooks and farmers.

The decision to translate the poem would have been much appreciated by Jemima who was passionate about her native tongue. 

Getting here

Huntly is easily accessible by road from both Aberdeen and Inverness, less than an hour by train from Aberdeen, and less than two hours from Inverness. There are also regular bus services. The festival takes place at No 30 and other venues in the main square.





The Venue

The venue for the two exhibitions and many of the events during the festival, is a converted and iconic listed building now known as Number 30, The Square, Huntly. Local people will remember it fondly, as Cruickshanks.

Built in 1875, Cruickshanks grew from a single shop to eventually become a large department store of more than 1,250 square metres spread over two and a half floors. The shop traded successfully for more than 140 years until 2018 when it finally closed its doors.

It was at that point that the Huntly Development Trust stepped in to bring the building into community ownership and convert it into a multi-use centre with a large gallery, cinema, cafe, shop and workspaces. Award winning architects, LDN designed the remodelled building in close consultation with HDT and the local community. After six years and a multi-million pound redevelopment project, the building is now open. The 2024 Festival of Illustration will showcase some of the many possibilities that this wonderful new facility can now offer the people of Huntly and the wider area.

So come along and see for yourselves.
